City Council meetings are held at the Willard City Hall (80 W 50 S) on the 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Thursdays of the month at 6:30 p.m. Agendas are posted at the City Hall and on the State of Utah public meeting notice website. <u>www.pmn.utah.gov</u>.

Planning Commission meetings are held at the Willard City Hall (80 W 50 S) on the 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Thursdays of the month at 6:30 p.m. Agendas are posted at the City Hall and on the State of Utah public meeting notice website <u>www.pmn.utah.gov</u>.

Services:

Water – Residential service is billed at \$25 monthly for up to 17,000 gallons. Amounts used over 17,000 is billed as follows:

\$1.10 per 1,000 gallons from 17,001 to 100,000 gallons (.0011/gal) \$1.20 per 1,000 gallons from 100,001 to 200,000 gallons (.0012/gal) \$1.50 per 1,000 gallons over 200,000 gallons (.0015/gal)

We advise you to locate your water meter and main shut off valve in your house before there is an emergency. Keep the meter clear of debris and vehicles. <u>Do not</u> shut off water at the meter. Contact the City Office if you need water shut off at the meter.

Sewer – Residential service is billed at \$59.50 monthly. Residents are responsible for the sewer service line from the house to the main line. Sewer backups are dangerous and costly. Please be careful of what you put down the drain and what you flush. Feminine products, diapers and wipes can cause backups into your home and damage to the treatment facility equipment. Let's keep things flowing downhill!! Also, it is a good idea to locate clean outs in your sewer line before there is an issue. Make sure they are accessible and capped so no debris can get down in the line.

Garbage service (Automated) each Tuesday except on major holidays at which time the service is on the Tuesday after the holiday. Replacement or additional containers are available from the City at a onetime fee of \$95.00. The monthly service fee is \$12 for the first can and \$12 for each additional can.

Bills for are sent by the 5th of each month for the prior month's service. Payments are due on the 20th and a \$5.00 late fee will be assessed if payments are not received by the 25th. Accounts two months past due will be placed on a shut off list and will be sent a notice to have the account brought current. Should shut off be required a turn on fee of \$50.00 will be assessed. TAMPERING with your meter is a \$500.00 violation.

Electronic payments can be made at <u>xpressbillpay.com</u>. You will need an email address and your account #. You will be able to pay your bill, view your bill and review account and usage information.

Streets – Please keep the city right of way clear of debris and remember to move trailers and vehicles well off the road. When it snows, do not plow the snow from your driveway into the streets as it freezes and damages the snow plows as well as creates a hazard for motorists and pedestrians. It is also a violation of City Code!

Parks & Recreation:

Willard has a great selection of parks and walking trails:

<u>Willard Park</u> – 50 W 50 N – This park has a bowery and picnic tables and can be reserved. Contact the City Office for fees and reservation information. This park shares the school grounds and a playground, ball field and walking track are also a part of this park.

<u>Children's Park</u> – 455 S 200 E – This is a small park with swings There are soccer goals (no nets) and an area to play basketball. Currently there is not a bowery or restrooms.

<u>Willow Creek Park</u> – 40 N 200 E – This park houses 2 baseball fields and a tennis court. A youth baseball program begins early May-June and includes T-Ball, Coach Pitch and a Major League. There is also a walking trail around this park and playground equipment.

<u>Willard Nature Park</u> – 150 N 100 E – This is a beautiful park (shown on front) and includes bowery (that can be reserved), picnic tables, playground equipment, walking trail and a fishing pond. Restrooms are open in the summer. Access is off of 100 N on 100 E.

<u>Walking Trail</u> – A walking trail is located on 200 West north of 750 North (SR315). A parking area is located at the trailhead.

Dog Licenses:

A maximum of 3 dogs are allowed at each residence and licenses are required. You must provide proof of current rabies vaccinations and proof of spay or neutering. Dog licenses are annual and expire December 31st of each year. Dog licenses fees are \$25 or \$10 if spayed or neutered. Be a good neighbor and clean up after your dog and remember your neighbor might not love your dog as much as you do.
